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FOREWORD

The book, Hazrat Sumayyah^{ra}, relates the inspiring story of Hazrat Sumayyah^{ra} who was one of the first people in Islam to die because of the cruelties of the disbelievers of Makkah.

She did not have any important connections in Makkah. Her husband, Hazrat Yaasir¹⁷, was an outsider while she was a slave. With no one to protect them, the family was savagely tortured by Abu Jahl and the other disbelievers. Hazrat Sumayyah¹⁷ died while she was being tortured. She thus became the first woman to lay down her life for Islam.

Among the martyrs in Islam, Hazrat Sumayyah¹² and her husband, Hazrat Yaasir¹³, are placed among

the highest. They were killed because of their love for Allah and the Holy Prophet Muhammad sas. Hazrat Sumayyah a, described as old and frail, had no one to defend her. She had no weapons, and so she was one of the most defenceless of all the martyrs of Islam. By laying down her life, she proved her devotion to Islam and became an inspiration to the early Muslims. She made the ultimate sacrifice by embracing martyrdom in the cause of the Faith.

Tahira Riaz originally wrote this book in Urdu, which was pubished under the title Hazrat Umme Haraam^{ra} bint Milhaan aur Hazrat Sumayyah^{ra} bint Khabbaat. While producing the English version, the two books were separated. Hazrat Umme Haraam^{ra} bint Milhaan is under preparation and will be published upon completion. This English version of Hazrat Sumayyah^{ra} the Daughter of Khabbaat is translated by Bushra Shahid of the English Translation




In response to his claims, the disbelievers

of Makkah bitterly opposed the Holy Prophet Muhammad sas. They became his worst enemies and inflicted various cruelties on the Muslims. They left no stone unturned in torturing Muslims and keeping them away from Islam. Even wealthy and respected people like Hazrat Abu Bakr Abu Bakr

We can only imagine how much greater the persecution was upon the Muslim companions who were poor. They had no one to help them, and they were hopelessly trapped in the chains of slavery.

Both men and women suffered the most cruel hardships. However, these great Muslims faced the cruelties and hardships inflicted upon them by the disbelievers of Makkah with great bravery and courage.

Their courage and endurance, as well as their unshakeable faith, earned them the everlasting life





CHAPTER TWO

Hazrat Sumayyah^{ra}, the daughter of Khabbaat, is included among the highest ranking *Sahaabiyaat* [female Companions of the Prophet^{sas}]. We do not know much about her ancestors; only the name of her father, Khabbaat, is known. We also do not know when and how she and her family reached Makkah. What is known is that she used to be the slave of Abu Huzaifah, son of al-Mugheerah. He was a rich man of the Makkan tribe called 'Banu Makhzum' during the period of Ignorance [the pre-Islamic times].


She was married to Hazrat Yaasir¹¹, the son of Aamir. He and his two brothers had come to Makkah from Yemen to search for their other brother who was lost. This happened about forty-five years before the Holy Prophet Muhammadsas claimed prophethood. Despite their search, they could not find their brother. Disappointed, the two brothers of Hazrat Yaasir^{ra} went back to Yemen, but Yaasir^{ra} remained permanently in Makkah. During his stay, Hazrat Yaasir^{ra} and Abu Huzaifah, son of al-Mugheerah Makhzumi, became friends. Abu Huzaifah arranged a marriage between his slave Hazrat Sumayyah™ and Hazrat Yaasir ra.

From this marriage, Hazrat Sumayyah¹² had three sons, Hazrat Ammaar¹³, Hazrat Abdullah¹⁴, and Harees. Her two sons Hazrat Ammaar¹⁴ and Hazrat Abdullah¹⁵ accepted Islam whereas the third son, Harees, was killed before Islam was introduced.

The family of Hazrat Sumayyah^{Ta} and Hazrat Yaasir^{Ta} frequently saw the Holy Prophet Muhammad^{SaS} as he was growing up. Since their children were around the same age as the Holy Prophet Muhammad^{SaS}, they were able to observe his blessed life. They were deeply impressed by his great personality and noble character. When the Holy Prophet Muhammad^{SaS} claimed to be a Prophet, this family accepted Islam right away.

It was a very difficult time for the Muslims in the beginning. Whoever in Makkah accepted Islam became a target of the wrath of the disbelievers. These cruel people did not spare anyone who accepted Islam, even their closest relatives.

At that time there was no police force to protect the rights of citizens. People were protected by their tribes, and their friends and family. Since Hazrat Yaasir¹² was from Yemen and was an outsider with





CHAPTER THREE

Both Hazrat Yaasir¹² and Hazrat Sumayyah¹² were old and frail, but they remained firm in their belief. Not even the most extreme cruelties of the disbelievers could make them budge an inch from Islam. Their faith was as solid as a rock; it could not be swept away by the stormy seas nor the raging winds.

The same was the case with their sons. It was an everyday routine of the disbelievers to place hot coals on the backs of those poor men. They would make them lie on the burning sands of Makkah in coats of

mail or their heads were forced repeatedly underwater to impose torture.

Once the Holy Prophet^{sas} passed by, as Hazrat Sumayyah^{ra} and her family were being tortured. He said, 'O sons of Yaasir! I give you the glad tidings that your destination is *Jannah* [Paradise].'

At another time when the Holy Prophet^{sas} saw Hazrat Sumayyah^{ra}, Hazrat Yaasir^{ra}, and their sons suffering, he said, 'Be patient. O, Lord! Forgive the children of Yaasir. And indeed You have forgiven them.'

The elderly Yaasir¹² died from these cruelties and became a martyr. The disbelievers still showed no mercy to this family, and they continued their atrocities on Hazrat Sumayyah¹² and her children.

One day when Hazrat Sumayyah^{ra} came home after enduring a day of hardships, Abu Jahl started cursing her. His violence increased until he killed

her with a spear. After that, he also martyred her son, Abdullah¹², with an arrow. Now, the only surviving person in her family was her son, Hazrat Ammaar¹².

He went straight to the Holy Prophet sas and weeping bitterly, related the incident of his mother's martyrdom to him. The Holy Prophet sas told him to be patient and prayed, 'O Allah! Save the children of Yaasir from the fire of Hell!'

The martyrdom of Hazrat Sumayyah¹² occurred in the sixth year of prophethood. She was the first woman to be martyred.

Abu Jahl, the murderer of Hazrat Sumayyah^{ra}, was killed in the second year of the Hijrah during the Battle of Badr. At that time, the Holy Prophet^{sas}, the Chief of both worlds, thought of Hazrat Sumayyah^{ra} and her great sacrifice. He called out to Hazrat Ammaar^{ra}, the son of Hazrat Sumayyah^{ra}, and said,

قَدْ قَتَلَ اللهُ قَاتِلَ أُمِّكَ Indeed, Allah has killed the murderer of your mother.

Hazrat Sumayyah^{Ta} stands out in history as one of the greatest inspirations of faith. As an elderly woman without any means to defend herself, she remained steadfast in her faith as she was being attacked by one of the most powerful men of Makkah. Her bravery is an example for us all. Although she was poor financially, she was rich spiritually; and although she was weak and old, she proved strong and vibrant in her faith. The courage she showed in the face of such hostility serves as an inspiration for us all.

May Allah, the Exalted, raise her status and allow us to follow in her footsteps. Aameen.

GLOSSARY

Aameen—A term which literally means, 'so let it be' and is used at the end of a supplication to pray that God may accept it. It is similar in meaning to 'amen'.

Battle of Badr—The first battle in the history of Islam in the second year after the Hijrah.

Bin—Son [of].

Coats of mail—A jacket of metal rings or plates used as armour for protection during war.

Hazrat—A term of respect used to show honour and reverence for a person of established righteousness

and piety. The literal meaning is: His/Her Holiness, Worship, Eminence, etc.

Hijrah—This Arabic word literally means 'migration' and refers to the migration of the Holy Prophet Muhammad^{sas} from Makkah to Madinah, which took place in 622 AD. This historical event marks the beginning of the Islamic calendar.

Huzur—Your Holiness.

Martyr—One who is killed because of his faith.

Sahaabiyaat—This refers to the female companions of the Holy Prophet sas.


